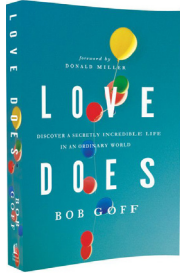

Bestselling author of “Love Does,” a book and movement about love in action, and founder of Restore International.



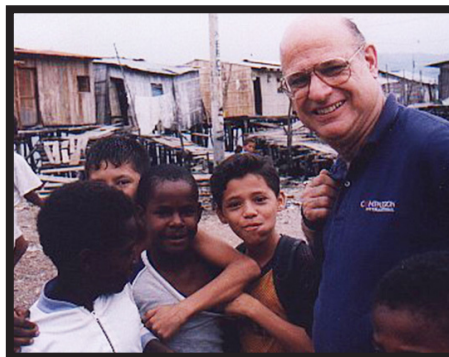

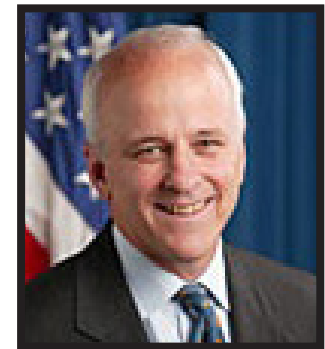

Jim Towey

Jim Towey became President/CEO of Ave Maria University on July 11, 2011 and currently serves in that position. During George W. Bush’s administration, he was Director of the White House Office of Faith-based and Community Initiatives.



Prior to his 2002-06 White House service, Towey was employed for 12 years as a U.S. legal counsel to Mother Teresa, traveling with her on numerous occasions. After serving as a full time volunteer in Mexico, he returned to Calcutta to work in her missions. Following his experience with Mother Teresa, President Towey was motivated to found the non-profit organization “Aging with Dignity.” It is his story of coming to know Mother Teresa that he will share with us.
