Today's Music: This morning's final hymn was written in 1749 by Charles Wesley. Originally set to nineteen stanzas, the text gained inspiration from a chance remark made by influential Morovian leader, Peter Bohler. He said, "Had I a thousand tongues, I would praise Christ Jesus with all of them." Wesley penned the text to this beloved Methodist hymn from the inspiration of Bohler's words, as well as on his own personal conversion experience at Aldersgate. One of the stanzas no longer in common use tells us of this experience: "I felt my Lord's atoning blood close to my soul applied. Me, me he loved – the son of God – for me, for me he died."
