We welcome violinist Dr. Barry Ross to worship this morning, who served as Assistant Conductor and Concertmaster of the Kalamazoo Symphony Orchestra (Michigan) for 35 years. Additionally, Dr. Ross was the first violinist to receive a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Yale University, and is Emeritus Professor of Music at Kalamazoo College. The violin Barry brings to Moorings today was made by Lorenzo Guadagnini in 1743, and produces a sound that is equal in caliber to the finest Stradivarius instruments.
